

Accountability/Commitment to Accomplishment

District accountability committee

The district accountability committee will consist of at least:

1. one parent
2. one teacher
3. one school administrator
4. one taxpayer from the district

The Board will strive to have a balance of membership consistent with the district's racial/ethnic proportions. The superintendent or other staff member designated by the Board will serve as a resource person.

Members of the district accountability committee will serve basic terms of three years with one third of the committee appointed annually as the committee directs. At the end of a member's term he/she will be surveyed in the spring as to their willingness to serve an additional three-year term(s). The committee will elect a chair from its membership, establish a schedule of meetings and adopt general rules for its operation. The members will be appointed by the Board of Education.

The Board, in cooperation with the district accountability committee, will approve general organizational accountability guidelines for the district which:

1. measure the adequacy and efficiency of educational programs offered by the district
2. make recommendations to the board relative to the program of accountability

The areas of study by the district accountability committee and other appropriate accountability committees shall be cooperatively determined at least annually by the committee and the board of education.
